Reading, PA Friday, October 12, 2018 – Reading Public Library will feature a variety of Franklin Institute Traveling Shows at three different branches in early November. The shows, sponsored by The Home for Orphans of Odd fellows Foundation, are as follows:

Monday, November 5, 5:30 pm, Main Library, 100 S. 5th St. - ***Flight***

Explore the exciting history of flight and investigate the Bernoulli principle. Mechanical birds, hot air balloons, and even a rocket launch are used to demonstrate the forces of flight.

Wednesday, November 7, 5:30 pm, Northeast Branch, 1348 N. 11th St. - ***Hot and Cold***

Explore the 3 states of matter and challenge ideas about what is hot and what is cold. Use liquid nitrogen to make balloons shrink, bubbles freeze, and a rubber ball shatter.

Monday, November 12, 5:30 pm, Southeast Branch, 1426 Perkiomen Ave. - ***Life in Space***

Explore the scientific and engineering challenges of getting to space, living and working in orbit, and safely returning to Earth.
